Ralph was invited to compete in the Dubai O-Plate last year. Stewart said: "It was our toughest test so far with the heat and a very problematic rental chassis." It took a day and a half to sort out a problem with air in the fuel line. "Once sorted Ralph was fired up and ready to show off his skills—at that point we had one of the slowest karts on the track." But Ralph still went on to set a new lap record before taking part in race day the very next day.

Ralph's racing career is zooming ahead. These photos show Ralph competing in the Dubai O-Plate race competition and guess what? He only came FIRST (AGAIN!). Not only is he the champion of the Dubai competition but he is the current British champion in the class of MightE karting.

Ralph's dad Stewart said: "Ralph's record at the minute is unblemished. He has entered five competitions in a new class and won every one! We've moved up in power to the fastest engine available for the season of 2024."

Ralph had to learn a whole new race strategy because the British open wheel race is quite different to the one in Dubai. In the end it was the best lap time win over three races. Ralph lost the first race by 0.07 of a second. He won the second race by 0.6 and the third by 0.06.

"It was unbelievably close," said Stewart. "I have a few more grey hairs but absolutely delighted that we came home the Dubai O-Plate champion."

Ralph said: "I loved it. I went out there not only to race but to spend time with my family. My dream is to be an F-1 driver. My hero is Max Verstappen. I would love to be like him." Ralph says he always tries to remember his dad's advice to stay calm when driving, and I think he can certainly keep his cool. CONGRATULATIONS Ralph. You are a SUPERSTAR!
